Nominating Committee Report (continued from Page 1) -



Tropical Cyclones

The FODR Meeting on September 19 featured an interesting and informative presentation on tropical cyclones (hurricanes) by Dr. David Malmquist of Virginia Institute of Marine Science (VIMS). Additional information is available on the VIMS website (http://www.vims.edu/features/research/storm_central.php) including:

- Tidewatch—which monitors water levels in near real time.
- Web Cams—which view water levels in real time in the VIMS Boat Basin and Osprey Cam which operates during the breeding & nesting season generally from March through October.
- VECOS—which operates a suite of buoys that record real-time wind speed, wave height and current velocity for various locations throughout the Chesapeake Bay.
- Tide Charts—for various locations on the Chesapeake Bay.
